



# Tzolkin

The Tzolkin is the sacred calendar of the Maya people of Central America and stands as one of the most accurate systems of tracking celestial mechanics from the Earth. It stands as a testament that delicate science can be separated from modern technology. It tracks cycles from as 'small' as a human gestation period, to the full precession of the equinoxes, a cycle of nearly 26000 years.

This system will be illustrated via a glass curtain made by Zak Jones, an artist from CMU, for whom this is a part of his developing thesis.
